Grape Variety : Pinot Noir

Soil : Limestone and clay

Site : This 2 hectare vineyard is located on the upper part of the hill, facing east. This vineyard was owned in the XIIIth century by a Canon of Beaune, Jean Bressand, hence the name "Bressandes. The soil combination of sand and clay with the ground rock produces wines with a beautiful tannic structure.

The Vintage 2008 : After a beautiful spring, the weather at the start of summer was quite demanding. It became fine again from the end of August with much sun and a cold wind, which aided concentration of flavours. The harvest commenced in mid-September in perfect conditions under an Indian summer. Aging in oak during 16 months

Tasting : Dark ruby colour. Very refreshing aromas of black berries and chocolate mixed with spices on a hint of vanilla. Well-balanced and well-structured. Very pure fruit. Fine texture.
